RESOLUTION.

Saltwood Castle Estate. Diversion of Right of Way.

WHEREAS REGINALD LAWRENCE LAWSON of Saltwood Castle within the District of this Council is desirous of diverting a public right of way across the lands of Saltwood Castle (of which he is the owner) in a manner shown by the plans already deposited with the Clerk to this Council and of substituting a right of way in lieu thereof along the Southern Railway line from the Railway Bridge (under which the present path goes to a Farm) past the Sheepwash and along the Railway line to Hythe Station and has requested the Rural District Council to take the necessary steps with a view to an application to Quarter Sessions for diversion and closure AND WHEREAS at the request of the Rural District Council of Elham this Council has considered the proposition put forward and unanimously consent to the proposition made by Mr R. L. Lawson and the diversion suggested by him, it being in the opinion of this Council that the substitution will be more convenient and the Council direct the Clerk to put this resolution forward for confirmation at a meeting of the Council to be held not less than two months after public notice shall have been given of this resolution pursuant to Section 51 of the Public Health Act 1894 and that subject to such confirmation the said Rural District Council be requested to arrange for two Justices of the Peace to view the proposed highway and issue their certificate accordingly.

The Plan above referred to can be inspected at the Clerk's Offices, 86 High Street, Hythe, on any day during the usual office hours within the next two months.
